



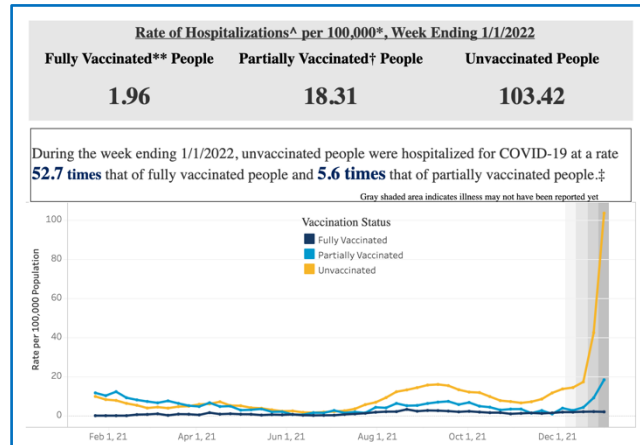
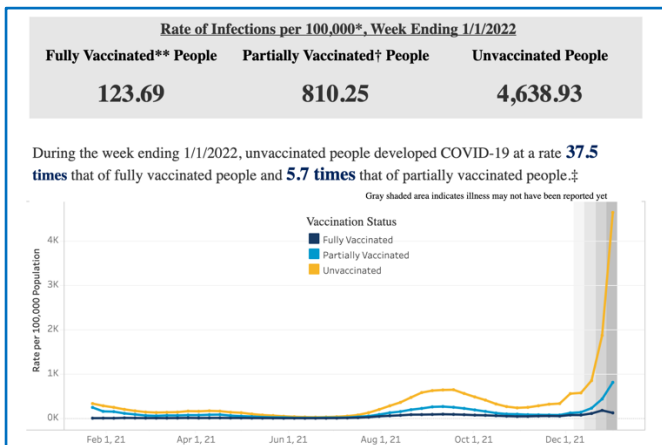

COVID-19 Situation Update 1/11/2022

Cumulative Roanoke City and Alleghany Health Districts: 46,929 (up 3786)

- Alleghany Health District: **30,809** total
- Roanoke City Health District: **16,120** total
- Approximately 15% of new cases are in children
- Just over 50% of new cases are in persons younger than 35 years of age
- The majority of new cases and hospitalizations continue to occur in individuals who are not fully vaccinated.
- *For the week ending in 1/1/2022, which is representative of current vaccination rates, people in Virginia who were not vaccinated developed COVID-19 at 35 times the rate as people who were fully vaccinated and **were hospitalized at a rate more than 50 times that of fully vaccinated people.***



People hospitalized with COVID-19, as of Monday 1/10/2022: 140

- 103 new hospitalizations
- 56 in the Roanoke City Health District, 47 in the Alleghany Health District
- As a reminder, these numbers reflect hospitalizations for residents of the RCAHD. An additional 55 individuals from outside of these districts are currently hospitalized in local hospitals.

COVID-19 related deaths, as of Tuesday 1/11/2022: 741

- 467 Alleghany Health District, 274 Roanoke City Health District

Vaccine Distribution:

Including all vaccinators, over 395,000 [doses of vaccine](#) had been administered to residents of Roanoke City and Alleghany Health Districts by 1/11/2022 including third/ booster doses.
